Curtis Wayne (Curly) Davis was born February 5, 1933 in Rockwall County to parents Lonnie Leon and Bessie Lorene (Daniels) Davis. He passed away on January 5, 2016 at the age of 82.

Curly proudly served his country in the United States Army from 1953 to 1955. On Feb. 9, 1953, he married the love of his life, Mary Frances Reynolds, and together they raised two children.
