Mayme was the first President of the Hico PTA and was a substitute teacher. She also served on Hico City Council, as Garden Club President and as a member of the Review Club. At First United Methodist Church of Hico, Mayme was a Sunday School teacher, member of United Methodist Women (UMW) and served too many other positions at FUMC to list.

Mayme's family, church and friends were her top priorities and after those she loved seeing to her clean house, flowers and working in her yard. From her youth, she loved racing cars and riding her motorcycle. Mayme was a graduate of Hico High School and went on to earn college credits through correspondence courses. She later worked with Meals on Wheels, City Beautification and interior decorating and helping her neighbors. After retiring from Casey's Auto Parts, she took art lessons and learned to play piano.

The greatest achievement of Mamye's life however, was being the best wife and mother a family could ever ask for. She will be greatly missed.
