She graduated from Tarleton State University with her Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education in 1976 and her MeD in Elementary Education in 1981 “She took every math class that Tarleton offered”, She was one of the best educators for 44 years. She taught at Walnut Springs ISD for 30 years and was a Mathematics professor at Tarleton State University for 14 years. Students all called her Mrs. J.
